INTRODUCTION

Most of the early cemeteries located on or near Fort Polk were quite small because the early settlements themselves were small and widely scattered. Settlements of the area currently encompassed by the Fort Polk boundaries were sparse prior to the Civil War. An estimate of less than 700 people in 1860 was calculated for an area of 218.5 square miles of the Main Fort and Peason Ridge area. This calculation determined a population density of 3.1 people per square mile (Smith 1999).

Some families have conducted their own cemetery research. Family genealogists learned very quickly that complete accuracy can be a very elusive thing. Events, dates, relationships and even names are sometimes misinterpreted over several generations. We have tried to make the information contained herein as accurate as possible. However, researchers should always attempt to find primary sources when conducting their own genealogical research. Hopefully this report will assist the researcher by narrowing their ancestral search.

It is apparent that most of the early graves were either unmarked or marked with perishable markers. Gravestones with death dates prior to 1872 have been identified for only twenty-two individuals beginning with Philemon Bryan in 1849 (McManus 1978, 1979, 1991).

Two Fullerton cemeteries are included in this report and, as far as can be determined, were never fully documented. These two cemeteries are presently located on the United States Department of Agriculture, Forest Service land; an area that is occasionally used by Fort Polk for training purposes.

1.0 ORGANIZATION OF RESEARCH AND USE OF REFERENCES CITED

Fourteen cemeteries, included herein, were assigned military map reference numbers. Some cemeteries assigned reference numbers had existing names. Other cemeteries have only a reference family or community name. Cemeteries in this report are referred to by either a name – Burns, Castor, Davis; reference number – Fort Polk 2, Fort Polk 7; or both designations. A list of cemeteries included in this report can be found on page 3, Table 1.1, of this document.

Some of these cemeteries have had various names or numbers over the years. Column three of Table 1.1 reflects the name of the cemeteries as they appear in this report. Column four reflects the starting page, in this document, of the referenced cemetery.

Section 2.0 contains information for each of the individual cemeteries covered by this review. Each cemetery recorded in this report was issued a separate corresponding number in this section for specific reference and designation. At the beginning of each cemetery section is a summary of where the cemetery is located and general directions for finding its location. Longitude and latitude coordinates are included; and, military grid coordinates are provided for the Fort Polk Special maps. We have also included the Universal Transverse Mercator (UTM) grid coordinates conversions to North American Datum (NAD) 1927 projections and given reference to the specific United States Geological Survey (USGS) 7.5 minute topographic quad sheets. A list follows with information for each individual burial located within the specific cemetery.

In many cases, grave markers were either missing or have become unreadable over time. In some of those cases, information regarding specific burials came from genealogical researchers or family members. Those entries are denoted with brackets.

Section 3.0 is an alphabetized name index of all names mentioned in the cemetery listings to assist researchers with locating specific individuals within this report. Reference page numbers are listed for each name.

Section 4.0 includes comments and results on geophysical and traditional surveying. In our efforts to determine the location of these cemeteries and document each burial within the cemetery several non-invasive survey methods were utilized. Geophysical survey methods were incorporated in this report for the two Fullerton cemeteries to document unmarked graves and compare the data results with plane table alidade mapping results.

Global Positioning System (GPS) data was collected and utilized to cross check mapping results from the two Fullerton cemeteries. GPS was also used at the Holly Springs cemetery.

Section 5.0 indicates the USGS 7.5 minute topographic quad sheet for each cemetery and gives the UTM projection for the actual cemetery location. This table is followed by 10 figures of reproduced 7.5 minute topographic quad sheets with cemeteries plotted. These figures are not intended to replace the use of topographic quad sheets. They have been inserted to aid the researcher in locating cemetery site locations.

Section 6.0 is a bibliography of the published source material utilized for this report.

2.0 CEMETERY LISTINGS

2.1 Burns Cemetery (Fort Polk #1 – Burns Cemetery)

This small cemetery is located near the southwest corner of North Fort Polk off of Texas Avenue at latitude 31.108N and longitude -93.182W. Go north on Texas to North Fort 0.2 miles before Avenue A and turn left onto a gravel road to the left. The cemetery is on right. The military grid coordinates are 15RVQ 82581 41673. It can be located on the Fort Polk 7.5 minute topographic quad sheet at 482580.6375 Easting and 344148.6692 Northing. (See figure 5.6)

Most of the markers are made of concrete and are difficult to impossible to read due to damage or erosion. Some were homemade with just a name and no dates; most of those were illegible.

2.2 Self Cemetery (Fort Polk #2 – Cavanaugh Cemetery)

This small cemetery, about 0.5 acre in size, is located on the gravel road behind the radio tower in North Fort Polk, and to the northwest of the Cantonment Area. Go to North Fort and go north on H Avenue. Turn left onto Gettysburg St. (gravel road). The cemetery is on the left 0.4 miles down the road. Its coordinates are latitude 31.126N and longitude -93.169W. The military grid coordinates on the Fort Polk Special are 15RVQ 83839 43628. It can be located on the Slagle 7.5 minute topographic quad sheet at 483838.6635 Easting and 3443443.6024 Northing. (See figure 5.2)

2.3 Haymon/Watson Cemetery (Fort Polk #3 – Watson Cemetery)

This cemetery is located east of North Fort Polk between Calhoun Branch and Birds Creek approximately 1.5 miles east of Birds Creek Bridge H-23 and then south 1.5 miles. Go out Artillery Road to Engineer Lake road. Turn right; then take the first gravel/dirt road to the right and go 1.4 mile. The cemetery will be on the right. It can be seen from the roadway approximately 40 yards off to the right.

It is located at coordinates latitude 31.105N and longitude -93.091W. The military grid coordinates for the Fort Polk Special is 15RVQ 91299 41245. It can be located on the Birds Creek 7.5 minute topographic quad sheet at 491298.8189 Easting and 3441060.6832 Northing. (See figure 5.7)

Its coordinates are latitude 31.08N and longitude -93.113W. The military grid coordinates for the Fort Polk Special is 15RVQ 89198 38529. Its coordinates are latitude 31.075N and longitude -93.157W. The military grid coordinates for the Fort Polk Special is 15RVQ 84945 38027. It can be located on the Fort Polk 7.5 minute topographic quad sheet at 484944.6869 Easting and 3437842.7934 Northing. (See figure 5.6)

Take the road to the right of the tower (Haynes Settlement Road) and go 0.2 miles and turn right onto a dirt road. The cemetery is approximately 0.8 miles down this road and is not accessible by vehicles. Therefore, walking will be required for the last 0.8 miles.

2.25 Fullerton Cemeteries

Samuel Holmes Fullerton built a mill and mill town in southeast Vernon Parish, in the heart of the best, thickest pineland in Louisiana. By the time the mill closed in 1927, it was the largest pine sawmill west of the Mississippi.

There are two known cemeteries on the land, though most of the graves are unmarked. They are both located on what is now the Kisatchie National Forest. Though this general area has occasionally been used for training by Fort Polk personnel, it is controlled and managed by the U.S. Forest Service.

2.25.1 Fullerton East Cemetery (Fort Polk #17 – Fullerton East Cemetery)

From Lookout Road, take Fullerton Road (Louisiana Highway 399 South) to Fullerton. Turn left onto Dove Field Road and travel approximately 1.5 miles. Take an unimproved road to the left and travel about 0.75 mile. The cemetery is along the roadside on the right. Take Lookout Road until you reach Fullerton Road and turn right onto Highway 399. Then turn left onto Forest road V131A (look for Dove Field Sign). Turn left onto Forest Road V131D and the cemetery is on the left.

2.27 Harriet Gill Cemetery (Fort Polk #15 – Harriet Gill Cemetery)

This cemetery was recorded on November 10, 2005 by James D. Grafton, Robert H. Hays, and M. Scott Faris, and contains one marker.

2.28 Dolly Gill Cemetery (Fort Polk #16 – Dolly Gill Cemetery)

This cemetery is located within the Limited Use Area of the Kisatchie National Forest, south of Louisiana Highway 10 and about one mile northeast of Providence Church, on the south side of Jackson Branch. Go south on Hwy 10, turn right onto Forest road 421, Turn left onto Forest Road 403, turn left on second dirt road before asphalt, cemetery is on the left Grid 25.2 – 81.2. The cemetery was identified in January, 2004 by a team of archaeologists from Panamerican Consultants, Inc.

It is located at latitude 30.96N and longitude -93.195W. The military grid coordinates are 15RVQ 81336 25144. The Dolly Gill Cemetery is located on the Hurricane Branch 7.5 minute topographic quad sheet at 481335.6131 Easting and 3424960.2351 Northing. (See figure 5.9)

3.0 Name Index

This index contains all of the names found in this report. Most were engraved on markers, though many of them are no longer legible due to weathering or broken and missing stones.

Where dates of birth and death were available, they are included in this index as well. Many names contained here are those of relatives of the deceased that were provided by families or other researchers. We have chosen to include all names in this index for the convenience of the reader.

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4.0 GEOPHYSICAL AND TRADITIONAL SURVEYING

Many of the historic cemeteries on Fort Polk lands have few, if any, marked graves. These old cemeteries often were not maintained as the years past without use. Rapid tree growth occurred and sometimes even tree harvesting. Mounds and depressions might be due to grave sites, fallen trees, or equipment use. A brief experiment using geophysical technology was used to see if more information could be obtained where grave sites were suggested by patterns, but not marked.

4.1 Geophysical Survey Problems in Louisiana

M. Scott Faris

Geophysical survey techniques as used in archaeology are important tools that can help archaeologists determine specific strategies for further work on a particular archaeological site. Although the data provided by geophysical surveying instruments is useful to the field archaeologist, these techniques cannot at this time replace excavation. However, the instruments and the data that they produce can be used to help narrow the field of endeavor and can save valuable time. Unfortunately, the use of geophysical surveying methods for archaeology is not an exact science; there are many variables involved that can skew data or provide inconclusive results. In Louisiana, geophysical survey can be problematic, and the difficulties encountered are illustrative of how wide-ranging variables can affect survey results.

Two archaeological projects come to mind when discussing geophysical surveying in Louisiana. One project, conducted jointly by Kevin McDonald of University College London and David Morgan of Northwestern State University of Louisiana, used geophysical surveying to try to locate building features on the site of a 19th Century plantation complex in central Louisiana within the Cane River floodplain. Both electromagnetic resistivity and magnetometry were used in order to provide comparable data. Although both instruments showed various anomalies present below ground surface in several areas, resultant “ground truthing” excavation yielded little in the way of noticeable features. The consensus of opinion among the project leaders was that extensive ground disturbance due to nearly 200 years of human occupation of the site and frequent flooding in the past may have thrown off the geophysics data.

Another archaeological project in Louisiana that utilized geophysical survey instruments was the Fort Jesup Archaeological Project, under the direction of Tommy Ike Hailey of Northwestern State University of Louisiana. During this project, three different instruments were used to provide maximum data for comparative analysis: ground penetrating radar, electromagnetic conductivity profiling, and cesium magnetometry. After an extensive literature research effort, project grids were laid out based on the approximate locations of buildings known to have existed during the Fort’s period of occupation. Then, the aforementioned instruments were passed over the grids using one meter transect intervals. Data was collected on-site and post-processed in the lab. By and large, the resultant plots created from the data revealed little in the way of buried

features; in fact, few anomalies whatsoever were located. Once again, there were many variables involved that may explain why the geophysical results were inconclusive. Extensive ground disturbance in the past 150 years, low soil moisture content (the project was conducted during the El Niño drought of 2000), high soil acidity (typical of Louisiana upland soils), and high background levels of aluminum (also associated with upland Louisiana soils) all may have contributed to the lack of conclusive results.

Although the geophysical survey data collected during the previously-mentioned projects was inconclusive, the techniques used are perfectly valid within an archaeological context. More and varied testing is needed in order to overcome the difficulties encountered during these projects; for instance, geophysical surveying could be conducted during different seasonal periods in order to determine whether soil moisture content and soil temperatures affect geophysical survey data. The collected data could then be compared in order to identify differences in below-ground anomaly sizes, shapes, and locations. Regardless of the time of year or methods used, however, there is no “magic bullet” that will ensure the collection of good geophysics data in western Louisiana. High soil acidity/aluminum levels and degree of soil disturbance due to the historic timber industry and other factors such as subsistence farming and natural climatic events (hurricanes and tropical storms) seem to play a major role in the validity of the survey data collected at Louisiana archaeological sites.

4.2 Geophysical Survey of Two Historic Cemeteries at Fort Polk, Louisiana

Michael L. Hargrave

Introduction

In February 2003, Dr. Michael L. Hargrave (ERDC-CERL) conducted geophysical surveys of two historic cemeteries located at Fort Polk, Louisiana. The surveys represented one component of Dr. Diane K. Mann’s project to document the history and present condition of these cemeteries. The small-scale geophysical surveys were intended to assess the potential usefulness of two techniques, magnetic field gradiometry and electrical resistivity, in detecting unmarked graves within the known boundaries of the two cemeteries. Many of the graves and grave markers at these cemeteries have been relocated, but it is possible that other (now unmarked) graves remain. One aspect of Dr. Mann’s project was a detailed mapping of the remaining grave markers and discernable depressions assumed to be associated with graves that have been relocated. These maps, created using an alidade and tapes, provide an opportunity to evaluate or ‘ground truth’ the potential contributions of the geophysical surveys.

4.2.1 Geophysical Methods

Geophysical techniques can detect subsurface cultural features that contrast with the surrounding soils in terms of electrical resistance, magnetic, or other properties. Factors that can create a geophysical contrast include soil compaction, particle size, organic content, artifact content, burning, and moisture retention. In general, any human action

that involves the localized disturbance of the soil is potentially detectable by geophysical techniques. The key issue is the strength of the contrast between the feature and the surrounding soil. Localized disturbances associated with tree roots, rodents, and other natural phenomena, as well as recent cultural activities (vehicle traffic, agriculture, etc.) are also often detectable and can complicate identification of the features of interest. In a geophysical map, cultural features and other discrete disturbances may appear as anomalies, i.e., highly localized areas characterized by geophysical values that differ from those of the surrounding area.

Several factors can complicate the detection of anomalies associated with archaeological features including historic graves. All geophysical surveys are to some extent affected by noise, a seemingly random component in the data attributable to the instrument itself, the operator's field technique, or variability in the site's soil, rocks, etc (Somers and Hargrave 2003). For example, there can be a substantial range of variation in the electrical resistance of undisturbed sandy soils, and this variation can obfuscate cultural features. Clutter refers to non-archaeological, non-random, discrete phenomena that complicate feature detection. Magnetic clutter at a historic cemetery can include infrastructure (utility pipes, etc.), cemetery fixtures (metal posts, wire or chain fences, etc.), and recent metallic trash. In general, the negative impacts of noise and clutter on survey success are inversely related to strength of feature contrast. But severe clutter (for example, substantial amounts of metallic trash in a magnetic survey) can preclude the detection of even high contrast features.

A considerable number of geophysical surveys of historic cemeteries have been conducted in the U.S., although relatively few have been reported in detail (e.g., Bevan 1991, Jones et al. 2003). One might assume that, given their size and relatively recent origin, historic graves would be much easier to detect than features such as storage pits and hearths at prehistoric habitation sites. In fact, this is not the case. Graves are often characterized by a very low-contrast with their surroundings because they were excavated as a single episode and then promptly refilled using the same soil. If the soil is rich in iron oxides and thus exhibits a high magnetic susceptibility (potential to be magnetized), it may be possible to detect a grave based simply on a highly localized disturbance of the soil strata. Such detection would typically require a high quality survey characterized by minimal noise and very little clutter (Clay 2005:101).

Magnetic detection of historic graves can also be based on the presence of iron artifacts including grave goods, coffin nails, handles, or other fittings. Grave depth is an important factor in that the potential for detecting a subsurface magnetic object is inversely related to distance from the sensor. The small nails used in the construction of a wooden coffin could be difficult or impossible to detect at the depths expected for historic graves. In general, the potential for magnetic detection of a grave based on its metal contents would be a factor of the amount (mass), arrangement, and depth of the metal objects in combination with the effects of noise and clutter.

Resistance surveys (Bevan 1998; Hargrave et al. 2002; Heimmer and De Vore 1995; Scollar 1990) introduce an electrical current into the ground and measure the ease or

difficulty with which the current (measured in ohms) flows through the soil. Archaeological features such as graves can be detected if they differ sufficiently from the surrounding soil in terms of their resistance to the passage of the current. The number and mobility of free charge carriers (principally soluble ions) are the primary determinants of electrical resistance. The simultaneous availability of soil moisture and soluble salts determines the free charge carrier concentration in the soil. The mobility of the soluble ions is governed by soil moisture content, soil grain size, temperature, soil compaction, and the surface chemistry of the soil grains (Somers and Hargrave 2001). The excavation of a grave typically involves a mixing of the soil strata that locally alters the moisture retention and compaction properties. In situations where the fill of an archaeological feature holds moisture more readily than the surrounding soils, it may be manifested by low resistance anomalies. Alternatively, features characterized by relatively coarse or loosely compacted, well-drained fill may be associated with high resistance anomalies.

4.2.2 Magnetic Field Gradient Survey

Two geophysical techniques were used in the 2003 survey: magnetic field gradiometry and electrical resistance (Bevan 1998; Hargrave et al. 2002; Heimmer and De Vore 1995; Scollar 1990). The magnetic survey was conducted using a Geoscan FM36 gradiometer. Geoscan Research, a small firm in Great Britain that produces geophysical instruments and software optimized for archaeological applications, manufactures this instrument. The gradiometer can measure exceedingly subtle disruptions in the earth's magnetic field that can be associated with prehistoric or historic cultural features as well as a wide range of natural phenomena.

The Geoscan FM36 records the difference between the values measured by two fluxgate sensors that are positioned at slightly different distances from the ground surface. To collect data, the surveyor walks along a predefined transect, carrying the gradiometer in one hand. A sound emitted by the instrument's automatic trigger allows the surveyor to distribute the data collection points at regular intervals along a non-magnetic tape or rope. The surveyor must take care to keep the tube containing the two magnetic sensors perpendicular to the ground surface. Deviations of the instrument from the perpendicular are manifested in the data as slightly anomalous readings. The overall effect of such anomalous values is to decrease the signal to noise ratio, making it less likely that very subtle features will be detected.

In preparation for the survey, metric tapes were used to establish five 20 by 20 meter blocks. Blocks of this size represent a widely used data collection unit for many geophysical studies, particularly those conducted using Geoscan instruments. Three survey blocks were established at the large cemetery and two at the small cemetery. Locations for the blocks were based on the presence of grave markers and shallow depressions (to ensure an opportunity to detect such features) as well as vegetation. It was necessary to locate the blocks in areas where it was feasible to remove enough vegetation to permit proper use of the gradiometer.

In each block, the survey began in the southwest corner. Data were collected from south to north only, using the procedure commonly referred to as parallel traverses. The transects, spaced at 1 meter intervals east west, were marked using nonmagnetic tapes held in place by plastic tent pegs. The gradiometer was set for its maximum resolution (.1 nanoTesla). In the gradiometer surveys, data values were collected at .125 m intervals as the surveyor moved along each transect. This strategy resulted in a relatively high-density survey (8 data values per m²) and reasonably high-resolution maps.

4.2.3 Electrical Resistance Survey

The resistance surveys were conducted using a Geoscan RM15 resistance meter equipped with a PA5 probe array and MPX multiplexer. The instrument was configured with three probes spaced at .5-m intervals, a configuration referred to by Geoscan as 'parallel twin'. This probe spacing was selected to maximize data density (4 per square meter), thereby increasing the potential for detecting relatively low-contrast features. Although the 50-cm probe spacing would not typically detect features that originated at a meter or more below surface, it was expected to permit detection of the upper portions of the grave shafts.

In the resistance survey, data values were collected at .5-m intervals along transects as the surveyor moved from south to north using the parallel traverse procedure. Two data values were collected each time the two pairs of probes were inserted into the ground. This strategy produced a relatively high-resolution survey that should be adequate to detect features such as historic graves.

4.2.4 Data Processing

The magnetic and resistance data were processed using Geoplot 3.00, a software package developed by Geoscan Research (Walker and Somers 2000) for archaeological applications. Geoplot routines were used to identify and remove data defects, detect anomalies that could be associated with cultural features, and to cosmetically improve the appearance of the maps. None of these processing steps resulted in the creation of anomalies that were not discernable in the raw (or at least, minimally processed) data.




Figure 1: Results of the magnetic field gradient (above) and electrical resistance survey (below) at the large cemetery site.

The processing sequence for the magnetic data was as follows. The Despike routine was first used to reduce the effects of isolated extreme values. The Zero Mean Traverse routine was then used to set the background mean of each traverse to zero. This removed much of the striping that is often present in the raw data. A Search and Replace was then used to replace values less than -10 nT and greater than 10 nT with a dummy value. Again, this action removed the effects of extreme values, and made it easier to detect subtle anomalies that could be associated with low-contrast graves. The data were then interpolated to achieve square pixels that each represented a .25 by .25-m square. Finally, a Low Pass Filter was conducted to remove high frequency, small-scale spatial detail (i.e., to smooth the data). The Low Pass Filter is often very effective in improving the visibility of the larger, weaker cultural features. As a final step, the processed data were imported into Surfer 8.0 to produce the image maps presented here (see Figures 1-4).

The resistance data were processed somewhat differently, although the processing objectives were similar to those of the magnetic surveys. Despiking was used to remove localized extreme values that occurred when a probe contacted a rock or other hard object. The resistance data were interpolated to achieve .25-m square pixels. A High Pass filter was then used to remove the effects of the geological background, thereby increasing the visibility of relatively small anomalies that could be associated with cultural features. Surfer 8.0 was used to produce the map included here.

Results of the geophysical surveys are presented in this report as gray-scale image maps (Figures 1-4). Note that the processed resistance and magnetic data are bipolar, with a mean of approximately zero (mapped as 50% gray). Positive values range from 50% gray to black, and negative values range from 50% gray to white. Contrast is set quite high to permit detection of fairly subtle anomalies. Actual interpretations of the data were made using both gray-scale and color maps. Maps viewed on the computer screen are, of course, much higher resolution and somewhat more readily interpretable than are the hard-copy maps provided here.




Figure 2: Results of the magnetic field gradient (above) and electrical resistance survey (below) at the large cemetery site. The locations of mapped graves are shown in yellow.




Figure 3: Results of electrical resistance (left) and magnetic field gradient (right) surveys at the small cemetery.




Figure 4: Results of electrical resistance (left) and magnetic field gradient (right) surveys at the small cemetery. Locations of the mapped graves are shown in yellow.

4.2.5 Results and Interpretations

A number of rectangular, low resistance (light colored) anomalies that are almost certainly associated with graves can be identified in Figures 1 and 3. Most of these anomalies exhibit the approximate size and shape expected of historic graves, and most display a consistent northeast southwest orientation. Although a number of clear anomalies can be detected in the magnetic data, these do not exhibit the size and shape expected of historic graves. In general, the magnetic data are much less interpretable than are the electrical resistance data.

Drs. John and Diane Mann used an alidade and tapes to map graves at the two cemeteries. The mapped graves (shown in yellow in Figures 2 and 4) were identified based on the presence of headstones, footstones, and/or depressions that exhibited the approximate size and shape of a grave. The original plan was to use the mapped graves as a basis for evaluating the effectiveness of the geophysical surveys. It was hoped that most or all of the graves visible on the surface would appear in the geophysical maps, and that additional (possibly undisturbed) graves might also be detected in the resistance and magnetic data. Unfortunately, it has not been possible to overlay the alidade and geophysical maps with complete confidence. Not all of the stakes that marked the corners

of the geophysical survey areas were included in the cemetery maps. It is also likely that the dense undergrowth (Figure 5) resulted in a small amount of error in the mapped locations of some graves. These factors explain the tendency (see Figure 2) for the yellow outlines of the mapped graves to occur near but not directly on the electrical resistance anomalies interpretable as graves. There are some strong indications of graves discernable in the resistance data that were apparently not visible on the surface (for example, in the northeast margins of the resistance map presented as Figure 4). On balance, however, the inability to overlay the alidade and geophysical maps with complete confidence makes it difficult to quantify the geophysical results.

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4.3 Cemeteries Fullerton East and West

C. John Mann

Cemeteries, 25. Fullerton East and 26. Fullerton West, were surveyed by plane table and stadia rod in March 2003 and checked for errors in February 2004 when Global Positioning System (GPS) data were added. Headstone information for Holly Springs Cemetery and GPS data also were collected in 2004.

Mapping methods employed at these cemeteries were rapid and imprecise. Table orientation was made by magnetic compass and was only approximate. No corrections were made for inclined readings of stadia rod. Instrument stations were not double-checked for accuracy nor was return closure made to initial station. Accuracy for Fullerton West is estimated to be $\pm 3\%$ whereas Fullerton East is estimated to be $\pm 10\%$ because many long stadia readings were taken, few horizontal readings were possible, and three gross errors were detected in checking the map.

No gross errors were detected in checking Fullerton West. This primarily was due, undoubtedly, because no long instrument shots were required and all were horizontal. Also, the small size of this cemetery permitted nearly all shots to be made from a single instrument station.

Most grave sites were inferred from depressions currently existing in soil at the cemetery. For Fullerton East only one was marked by a cast-iron fence and only a handful of headstones or footstones exist; 2 or 3 of these stones probably are not in their original locations. More head and foot stones remain at Fullerton West where only 36 burial sites are inferred.

Clearly, all GPS data similarly are imprecise. They agree only approximately with magnetic data, U.S. Geological Survey (USGS) topographic maps, military maps, and existing man-made features and property lines (fences) known to be north-south or east-west. Most likely these errors have arisen from small errors in reading GPS instruments

and recording the readings, inaccurate or imprecise GPS equipment, deteriorated GPS signals received at the site because of numerous trees, and errors in plane table mapping. Probably all these factors have contributed to poor GPS data.



FIGURE 5.2 SLAGLE 7.5 MINUTE TOPOGRAPHIC QUAD (1974)




FIGURE 5.3 SIMPSON SOUTH 7.5 MINUTE TOPOGRAPHIC QUAD (1974)




FIGURE 5.5 NEW LLANO 7.5 MINUTE TOPOGRAPHIC QUAD (1954*)





FIGURE 5.7 BIRDS CREEK 7.5 MINUTE TOPOGRAPHIC QUAD (1974)




